## When El-Shaddai Changes Your Name

Scripture: Genesis 16:1-16

Also: Genesis 15:5-6; 1 Timothy 6:6-10

## Questions

- 1. What has challenged you, changed you or confused you from this week's sermon or the Scriptures in it?
- 2. This week, from the story about God changing Abram's name to Abraham, we learned that:
  - God invites us to be faithful to the covenant
  - God guarantees His promises to the faithful by giving Abraham a new name
  - o God demands that His people be set apart for the covenant
  - o God plans to fulfill His promises in ways that seem impossible
- 3. When it comes to names, what does the Bible say about God knowing us?
  - o Read Exodus 33:17; Isaiah 43:1-2; 49:1; Jeremiah 1:5; John 10:3, 14-15; Matthew 10:29-31.
  - You don't need to share these, but what are some things that God knows about you that no one else does?
- 4. Covenant language is not as familiar to us today; it can be described as a contract, but with love, heart, relationship.
  - What contracts are you in? (A house payment, a lease on a car, etc)
  - What covenants are you in? (family, friends, etc)
  - When you think about having an agreement with God, and on His end is unlimited knowledge, power, and presence, how does that impact you?
- 5. What are some promises from the Bible that are important to you?
- 6. Read Galatians 5:6. Circumcision (as a sign of the old covenant) has been replaced in the New Testament by "faith working through love". Described another way, it's having a heart circumcision. The questions asked at the conclusion of the sermon are a great place to end discussion.
  - o Am I circumcised in heart?
  - Am I faithful to the covenant?
  - Do I trust God's promises even when their fulfillment seems impossible?
